Re: POLICE (SAPOL) STAFF NUMBERS - FOR DISCUSSION

At the two previous Joint Party Room meetings where policy papers were presented I outlined the position that Government should look to train 1000 - 1200 police over the next four years. At current attrition rates this would mean funding an extra 400- 500 sworn officers over a four year period. I also indicated specific initiatives that should be examined that would make up some of the extra numbers required.

This note is provided for discussion and gives an update on the status of Police numbers, both sworn and unsworn, as well as detailing suggested increases in police numbers and the estimated cost for the next financial year.

CURRENT STATUS OF SAPOL NUMBERS

The total number of sworn officers within SAPOL stands at 3,615 which is 1.2% less, or 44 officers less than the total strength in 1993.

The total number of sworn and unsworn officers has increased by 169 FTE from 4,390 to 4,559 which equates to an increase of 3.85% since 1993

By July 2002 the number of sworn officers within SAPOL will reach 3,749, the highest level for 10 years - with 2.5% more (or 90) sworn officers than the total strength in 1993.

By July 2002 total number of sworn and unsworn officers will have reached 4,666 an increase of 276 FTE or 6.28% since 1993.

Estimated figures for the financial year ending 30/6/02 (Table 1) includes the additional 113 (recruited in 2000-2001) and the additional 90 police staff allocated within the 2001-2002 budget. Details of staff movements since 1993 are detailed within Table 2.

NEW INITIATIVES

Not withstanding the fact that by July 2002 the number of sworn officers will be 2.5% above what the Government inherited in 1993 I am of the view that Government will be placed in a vulnerable position if further increases are not announced for the next year.

In this context I am indicating to Cabinet that a minimum of an extra 87 officers should be funded in the next financial year for the following purposes:

• The establishment of a Strike Force of 20 officers to investigate interstate and intrastate drug trafficking particularly focussing on organised drug syndicates (current bilateral bid with a cost of \$1.9M ongoing)

 An increase of 23 police for general policing in regional SA in keeping with the strategy outlined in the election policy paper to ensure that in any extra police numbers, regional communities received their per capita share.

A breakdown by area is outlined and has been signed off by the Commissioner of Police: (est cost \$2.3 M ongoing)

- Pilot Police in Schools program be expanded to allow the placement of an officer in 20 schools across SA. (est cost \$1.8M ongoing)
- Establish a 5 man DNA unit (3 police, 2 civilians) to assist in clearing unsolved crime and provide increased support for the soon to be introduced DNA legislation. (est cost \$500,000 ongoing)
- An increase of 20 officers to expand mounted police for general street patrols and to enhance police visibility within the Adelaide CBD and at major events and to establish a police sniffer dog and officer in the metropolitan LSA's. (est cost \$2.0M ongoing)
