ABS BUILDING APPROVALS, MAY 2016

Summary

During May 2016, the number of new dwellings approved:

- rose by 1.9% in South Australia in <u>trend</u> terms (nationally, new dwelling approvals rose 0.9%); and
- fell by 13% in South Australia in seasonally adjusted terms (nationally, new dwelling approvals fell 5.2%).

Further Analysis

Trend data


The total number of dwelling approvals in South Australia in May 2016 was 23% higher than a year ago. Nationally, the number of dwelling approvals was 2.2% lower than a year ago – see Chart 1 and Table 1.

The number of <u>private sector houses</u> approved for construction in South Australia rose by 1.9% during May to be 13% higher than a year ago — see Chart 2.


Private 'other' dwelling approvals in South Australia rose by 1.3% during May to be 47% higher than a year earlier.






Nationally, the number of private sector houses approved for construction rose by 0.2% during May, while the number of private 'other' dwelling approvals rose by 1.6%.



The value of renovation approvals in South Australia rose by 1.8% during May and was 6.0% higher than a year ago. Nationally, the value of renovation approvals rose 1.5% in May to be 0.4% higher than a year earlier—see Chart 3.





During May, the value of non-residential building approvals fell by 0.2% in South Australia but was 24% higher than a year earlier. Nationally, the value of non-residential building approvals fell by 0.2% during May but was unchanged compared with a year ago—see Chart 4.

Note: The ABS excludes large irregular movements in a seasonally adjusted series when calculating a trend series. This is pertinent in this brief where seasonally adjusted private sector 'other dwellings' has recorded large irregular movements in South Australia, and explains why there is a large difference in the movement of these series.
