Minutes

1. Welcome and apologies

- 1.1 Ms Leonie Muldoon was an apology, with all other members present
- 1.2 Dr Evan Everest, Supt Cath Hilliard, Mr Rick Persse, Dr Chris Lease, Mr Done Frater and Ms Ingrid Norman attended as guests.

2. AHPPC Update

- 2.1 CPHO noted another truck driver had tested positive, creating exposure sites from 30 August, with identified exposed staff and close contacts quarantining.
- 2.2 CPHO noted continued high levels of community transmission in the NSW outbreak.

3. Minutes

- 3.1 The minutes of the previous two meetings (20 and 24 August 2021) were endorsed.

4. Cross border travel update

- 4.1 The Committee noted the outbreak in Katherine had resolved and recommended to the State Coordinator that all remaining travel restrictions on people arriving from that LGA could be lifted.
- 4.2 The Committee discussed the risk in South East Queensland, noting that the last identified exposure site was on 4 August 2021, and accordingly recommended to the State Coordinator that all remaining travel restrictions on people arriving from South East Queensland could be lifted, noting that people who had arrived prior to this change would need to continue to abide by the restrictions that applied at the time of their arrival, including testing.

5. Public activities update

- 5.1 The Committee discussed the cap on private activities, noting that the limit is different to private functions in licenced venues owing to the additional controls on licenced venues.
