2. Queensland case update and cross border travel

2.1 The CPHO provided an update on the COVID-19 situation in Queensland and NSW.

2.2 The CPHO advised:

- All current cases in Queensland have been traced/linked and QLD Health understand the source of infection.
- QLD Health is confident that they have identified the vast majority of people who were at exposure sites and sent relevant people into quarantine.
- Testing rates in Queensland are high and steady at around 20,000 a day.
- Together this gives us confidence there is a low risk that further community transmission is occurring.
