Minutes

1. Welcome and apologies

- 1.1 All members present via Microsoft Teams.
- 1.2 Mr Rick Persse, Ms Ingrid Norman, Dr Evan Everest, Supt Stuart McLean, Dr Chris Lease and Mr Don Frater attended as guests.
- 1.3 The Chair noted the objective of this meeting was to set a pathway out of lockdown for announcement tomorrow morning.

2. Outbreak update

- 2.1 CPHO provided detail on the outbreak management, with QR check in critical in identifying primary and close contacts, with those at high risk exposure venues quarantined in medihotel facilities, and good testing levels.
- 2.2 CPHO noted a new case had been identified related to the Greek on Halifax exposure.
- 2.3 CPHO described current risks including that while there are very good processes for identifying primary and secondary contacts there remained a possibility that someone was missed. Additionally, for those outside of supervised quarantine compliance with quarantine measures cannot be guaranteed.
- 2.4 CPHO noted the importance of emphasising that when the stay at home order is rescinded people who are under a quarantine direction must remain isolated.

3. Public activities

- 3.1 The Committee discussed a return to Level 3 public activities from 0001 hours Wednesday 28 July , with some additional restrictions to provide greater management of risk while we remain in the 14 day incubation period from the initial community exposures.
- 3.2 The Committee recommended to the State Coordinator the following restrictions from Level 3 will apply:
